b) How are the truths of verses 4-7 crucial to being able to be the type of person Paul prescribes?

c) If God is sovereign and we have the "hope of eternal life" (v. 7b), then how does that knowledge help us do the following:

- Do good works without earthly rewards?
- Show kindness and gentleness to all people?
- Not slander or quarrel?

d) Where might God be inviting you to repent?

**Apply the Word:**

a) Is your life foundation more based on your circumstances or God's sovereignty?

b) How have you experienced the truth that God's plans for your life are often not your plans for your life? Have come to realize this is okay and not a bad thing?

- Pre-decide HOW you will respond when a crisis occurs?
