



ELEMENTARY KIDS CLUB

October 2018

Kids Club is an environment designed to complement the primary large group/small group kids experience. Kids Club also allows parents to participate in serving. K-5th graders who stay for two consecutive services may join Kids Club.

The goal of Kids Club is to:

- Give kids opportunities to practice Bible Skills and learn memory verses.
- Provide many different types of service experiences for kids.
- Create opportunities for social growth as kids have fun together.

A monthly goal to commit to the kids to learning specific Bible knowledge. (i.e. books of the New Testament, Bible Verses, or classification of books of the Bible)

Each month kids will experience four or five different themed weeks that will repeat from month-to-month.

Suggested Schedule

10 minutes—Kids arrive and begin rotation stations or free play

30-40 minutes—Weekly curriculum activities

15 minutes—Directed rotation stations

5 minutes—Dismissal

Week 2: October 14th

Main Point: God is always with me, so I can have the courage to do what He asks.

Bible Story: Moses: The Burning Bush (Exodus 3:1-7:13)

Memory Verse: “This is my command—be strong and courageous! Do not be afraid or discouraged. For the Lord your God is with you wherever you go.” Joshua 1:9

Prepare

- Go to the NEW Kids Club Resources Page (www.rockbridge.cc/kc-resources) And review curriculum to be best prepared before kids come to the classroom.
- Have kids put away toys when you are ready start, to avoid distractions.
- Supplies: Bibles for each kid, playpen balls (for points), 2 buckets (or laundry baskets to hold playpen balls) computer/tablet/phone, website link: <https://quizlet.com/10777012/flashcards>
- **Younger kids: Books of the Bible cards, piece of paper, markers, list of Old Testament Books.

****LEADERS** Remember our goal in kids club is to help the kids learn to navigate the Word of God. We want to devote much of our time together to helping them reach the goal for this month.**

October 2018 Kids Club Goal: That all kids in our kids club area at the end of October have learned how to look up books/scriptures in the Bible.

Activity 1: Review (5 minutes)

1. Ask kids: “What was today’s main point?”
2. Ask kids: “What is the verse for today?”
3. Ask kids: “What was the Bible story about?”

Activity 2: Bible Sword Drill Game

Divide kids into teams (either making it even between older kids and younger kids or dividing into two separate groups by age and then dividing those kids i.e. 3rd,4th,5th graders are not playing the game with K,1,2 - But against each other)

Use computer/tablet/phone to access: <https://quizlet.com/10777012/flashcards> (use these flash cards for kids to look up those scriptures. You can make it more fun by starting with saying

“Attention! Draw your swords!” (they can put the Bible above their heads) give them the scripture & then say “Charge!” There are 25 flashcards. You may not make it through them all, but can use more of them later this month.

For each team that has the first teammate to find the scripture gets 1 point in their bucket. And when all teammates have found the scripture that team gets 2 points.

Option 2: Bible Drills (PIG) Just like the basketball game PIG, only its the last kid to find the scripture that gets a letter added to their letters. Once they hit PIG then they are out. (Continue to encourage them to look up the scriptures to get more practice as you’re likely to play another round.

Younger kid options: For younger kids lay out 5 books of the Bible (preferably with different beginning letter sounds) Example: you lay out the books Matthew, Luke, John, 1 Corinthians, Romans. You ask them to point to the card that says ‘Luke’ If they don’t know say “Luke, Luke starts with (make an L sound) what letter is that? - - L! You’re right! -- so where is the one that starts with the letter L?” So on and so forth, this will help them become accustomed to hearing the books of the Bible names and start looking at them as words.

Option 2: Say the books of the Bible in order and have the kids draw/color the first letter of the book of the Bible.

Activity 3: Prayer time (10 mins)

Ask the kids what they think God is trying to teach them, and pray that they would press into growing closer to God.

Younger Kids: have them draw a picture of their families, and pray for them and their families.

Activity 4: Pick- Up(10 minutes)

As parents pick up their kids be sure to check their claim stickers. Make sure parents know that our goal for this month is working on learning how to navigate their Bible through sword drills.
