You've probably heard the definition of parables as "earthly stories with a heavenly meaning."

In Matthew 13:10–11, Jesus' disciples came to Him and asked why He was speaking to the people in parables. His reply is somewhat puzzling, "Because the knowledge of the secrets of the kingdom of heaven has been given to you, but not to them." He goes on to explain further in verse 16, "But blessed are your eyes because they see, and your ears because they hear." Jesus told these stories so that those who were prepared to hear the truth about who He is would grasp the heavenly meaning of these earthly stories.

Stories have a way of igniting our imaginations and forging direct paths to our hearts. Perhaps that's why children seem to connect with the parables—their imaginations remain active, ready to paint a vivid picture in their minds of the parable. The image of building a house on sand takes them to the sandcastles they have built on a beach, the farmer sowing seed becomes a timeless character, the good Samaritan gives a face to their concern for someone who is hurting, and the father who runs toward his lost son offers an embrace they can imagine from memories in their own lives.

Out of His deep love for us, Jesus told stories that activate the imagination and the heart, stories that allow us to feel the deep truths of His compassion and care for His people.
