Question:

What do you think God thinks about when God thinks about you?

I Peter 3:18

For Christ also <u>suffered for sins</u> once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, that He might bring <u>you to God</u>. He was put to <u>death</u> in the flesh but made <u>alive</u> by the Spirit

"bring you to God" □ with

"With" is a problem for God.

Romans 3:23

For <u>all</u> have sinned and <u>fall short</u> of the glory of God.

Romans 4:25

He was handed over to die because of our sins, and He was <u>raised to life</u> to make us right <u>with God</u>.

God's "with" problem is solved by <u>Jesus</u>—His perfect life, substitutionary death, and victorious resurrection.

Now, God can freely & graciously give us an invitation to be with Him.

"With" is also a problem for us ...

John 3:19

And the judgment is based on this fact: God's Light came into the world, but people loved the darkness more than the Light ...

Our "WITH" problem is solved when we see WHO God is and HOW MUCH He wants to be WITH us ... at great cost to Himself.

Luke 15:1-2

All the <u>tax collectors and sinners</u> were approaching to listen to Him. ² And the Pharisees and scribes were complaining, "This man welcomes sinners and eats <u>with</u> them."

3 Parables:

- Lost sheep, Lost coin & Lost son
- Effort to be "with" (reunite, restore, reconcile)
- 3 Parties: celebration of the response

Luke 15:8-10

"Or what woman who has ten silver coins, if she loses one coin, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and <u>search carefully</u> until she finds it? ⁹ When she finds it, she calls her friends and neighbors together, saying, '<u>Rejoice with me</u>, because I have found the silver coin I lost!' ¹⁰ I tell you, in the same way, there is <u>joy</u> in the presence of God's angels over one sinner who <u>repents</u>."

Luke 15:11-13

He also said, "A man had two sons. ¹² The younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of the estate I have coming to me.' So he distributed the assets to them. ¹³ Not many days later, the younger son gathered together all he had and traveled to a distant country, where he squandered his estate in foolish living.

Our "with" problem ... we prefer something other than God.

This creates another problem:

When we break our connection with God, we end up <u>attached</u> to something else (<u>enslaved</u>).

Luke 15:14-16

After he had spent everything, a severe famine struck that country, and he had nothing. ¹⁵ Then he went to work for one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed pigs. ¹⁶ He longed to eat his fill from the pods that the pigs were eating, but no one would give him anything.

Luke 15:17-20a

When he came to his senses, he said, 'How many of my father's hired workers have more than enough food, and here I am dying of hunger! ¹⁸ I'll get up, go to my father, and say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and in your sight. ¹⁹ I'm no longer worthy to be called your son. Make me like one of your hired workers." ²⁰ So he got up and went to his father.

Now, we have another "with" problem:

When we think about ourselves, we think in terms of DO, DOING, DONE.

Luke 15:20

So he got up and went to his father. But while the son was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with <u>compassion</u>. He <u>ran</u>, threw his arms around his neck, and kissed him.

Luke 15:21

The son said to him, 'Father, <u>I have sinned</u> against heaven and in your sight. I'm no longer worthy to be called your son.'

Luke 25:22-24

"<u>But</u> the father told his servants, 'Quick! Bring out the best robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. ²³ Then bring the fattened calf and slaughter it, and let's <u>celebrate</u> with a feast, ²⁴ because this son of mine was <u>dead</u> and is <u>alive</u> <u>again</u>; he was lost and is found!' So they began to celebrate.

They celebrate: "with"

The response of the son: repentance & reception of grace & mercy

Luke 25:25-28a

"Now his older son was in the field; as he came near the house, he heard music and dancing. ²⁶ So he summoned one of the servants, questioning what these things meant. ²⁷ 'Your brother is here,' he told him, 'and your father has slaughtered the fattened calf because he has him back safe and sound.' ²⁸ "Then he became angry and didn't want to go in ...

Luke 25:28b-30

So his father came out and pleaded with him. ²⁹ But he replied to his father, 'Look, I have been slaving many years for you, and I have never disobeyed your orders, yet you never gave me a goat so that I could celebrate with my friends. ³⁰ But when this son of yours came, who has devoured your assets with prostitutes, you slaughtered the fattened calf for him.'
