<u>John 12:1-3</u>

Six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany where Lazarus was, the one Jesus had raised from the dead. ² So they gave a dinner for Him there; Martha was serving them, and Lazarus was one of those reclining at the table with Him. ³ Then Mary took a pound of perfume, pure and <u>expensive</u> nard, anointed Jesus's feet, and wiped his feet with her hair. So the house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume.

See Jesus clearly:

He is MORE THAN a teacher, MORE THAN Savior, and MORE THAN Lord.

<u>John 12:4-5</u>

Then one of His disciples, <u>Judas Iscariot</u> (who was about to betray Him), said, ⁵ "Why wasn't this perfume sold for <u>three hundred denarii</u> and <u>given to the poor</u>?"

IF ... THEN ...

Who is Judas seeing ... (or missing)?

John 12:6

He didn't say this because he cared about the poor but because he was a <u>thief</u>. He was in <u>charge of the money-bag</u> and would steal part of what was put in it.

Worth of Jesus (Mary's act of worship) vs. Worth of Money (Judas' reaction)

Matthew 26:14-16

<u>Then</u> one of the Twelve, the man called <u>Judas Iscariot</u>, went to the chief priests ¹⁵ and said, "What are you willing <u>to give me</u> if I hand Him over to you?" So they weighed out <u>thirty pieces of silver</u> for him. ¹⁶ And from that time he started looking for a good opportunity to betray Him [Jesus].

Judas sold out the eternal Treasure for 30 pieces of silver.

Judas is not an anomaly; he is a representative of humanity.

How we know Jesus ultimately determines if we follow Jesus for the long haul.

If we miss <u>Jesus' worth</u>, we will leave Him at the crossroads.

Luke 22:1-3

The Festival of Unleavened Bread, which is called Passover, was approaching. ² The chief priests and the scribes were looking for a way to put him to death ... ³ Then <u>Satan</u> <u>entered Judas</u>, called Iscariot, who was numbered among the Twelve.

Ephesians 2:2-3a (NLT)

You used to <u>live in sin</u>, just like the rest of the world, <u>obeying the devil</u>—the commander of the powers in the unseen world. He is the spirit at work in the hearts of <u>those who</u> <u>refuse to obey God</u>. ³ All of us used to live that way, following the passionate desires and inclinations of our sinful nature.

Satan does not take innocent people captive because there are no innocent people.

Satan has power wherever sinful passions are valued/pursued more than Jesus.

{all together same slide} **Satan seeks a <u>foothold</u> in our life. <u>Ephesians 4:27</u> ... do not give the devil a <u>foothold</u>.**

The most effective way for Satan to "blind us" is to get us to focus on ourselves.

Luke 22:31-32
