{First line comes up; 2 questions come up together but after the first statement} **Everyone needs** help.

Will we ask for it?
Where will we turn for it?

{bullets come up one at a time}

There's actually anxiety about asking for help!

- Pride: "I got this ..."; "I should be able to handle this ..."
- Not wanting to bother
- "Just can't get good help these days ..."

Psalm 121:1

I lift my eyes toward the mountains. Where will my help come from?

Psalm 121:2

My help comes from the Lord, the Maker of heaven and earth.

Have I really asked God for help?

Image of God: Maker AND Helper

Many of us live with a secret arrangement:

God: handles the really big stuff We: handle everything else

{come up one at a time ...}

Our "Real" Prayer Lives:

- We really pray generally but not specifically
- We really pray occasionally (seasonally) but not daily
- We live anxiously

Philippians 4:6

Don't worry about anything, but <u>in everything</u>, through <u>prayer and petition</u> with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.

Luke 11:1-3

He said to them, "Whenever you pray, say,

Father, Your name be honored as holy.

Your kingdom come.

³ Give us <u>each day</u> our <u>daily bread</u>.

The Invitation:

- Know God as Holy → The Most High God
- Know God as Father

{Each bullet come up separately; 2 slides is fine but keep the Heading}

The Invitation:

- Because God is the Most High God everything is <u>small</u> to Him but because He is also our Father, everything is <u>important</u> to Him.
- Therefore, pray specific, pray small and pray without ceasing ... really!!

Corrie Ten Boom:

If a care is too small to be turned into a prayer, then it is too small to be turned into a burden.

- 1) **Exalt** before we ask (usually).
- 2) Realize, if the Lord is not my <u>Helper</u>, then I'll end up <u>hurting</u> myself and/or others.

But why do we have to ask and ask daily ...?

- God is <u>relational</u> ... by <u>consent, not coercion</u>.
- "Daily" describes how God wants to be known.
- 3) When I pray "in general", I'll know and experience God "in general."

{one slide; keep formatting}

There is often a <u>correlation</u> between how I pray and how I <u>experience</u> God. Specific → Personal General → Generic

How Daily Bread Arrives:

- Needs over wants
- Sanctification
- Truth & Wisdom: perspective, promise, path
- Reminders ...
- Taste & See: He is good!
- Affirmation
- Opportunity; Breakthrough
 - 4) "Daily" describes when His grace arrives.

<u>Lamentations 3:22-23</u> (NASB)

The Lord's lovingkindnesses indeed never cease, For His compassions never fail. ²³ *They* are new every morning; Great is Your faithfulness

Anxiety is living out the "imagined" future before it gets here and yet grace arrives "just in time."
