Luke 2:10-12

But the angel said to them {*shepherds*}, "Don't be afraid, for look, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people: ¹¹ Today in the city of David a <u>Savior</u> was born for you, who is the <u>Messiah</u>, the <u>Lord</u>. ¹² This will be the <u>sign</u> for you: You will find a baby wrapped tightly in cloth and lying in a <u>manger</u>."

Luke is telling us that the **particular circumstances** of Jesus' birth are significant.

Luke 2:1-5

In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that the whole empire should be registered. ² This first registration took place while Quirinius was governing Syria. ³ So everyone went to be registered, each to his own town.

⁴ Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called <u>Bethlehem</u>, because he was of the house and family line of David, ⁵ to be registered along with Mary, who was engaged to him and was <u>pregnant</u>.

Mary & Joseph did not get to plan this; they had to accept it.

Micah 5:2

But you, O <u>Bethlehem</u> ... are only a small village among all the people of Judah. Yet a <u>ruler of Israel</u>, whose origins are in the distant past, will come from you on My behalf.

Luke 2:6-7

While they were there, the time came for her to give birth. Then she gave birth to her firstborn son, and she wrapped him tightly in cloth and laid him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

Galatians 4:4 (NLT)

But when the right time came, God sent His Son, born of a woman ...

Titus 1:2

... the hope of eternal life that God, who cannot lie, promised before time began.

Ephesians 3:11

- ... according to His eternal purpose accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord.
- → The manger: what seems like the absence of God's presence is actually the sign of it!

At some point in our lives, we will be involved in circumstances that seem to contradict the character, promises and purposes of God.

<u>Isaiah 9:6-7</u> (Luke 1:32-33)

For to us a Child is born, to us <u>a son is given</u>; and the government shall be upon His shoulder, and His Name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. ⁷ Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end

Philippians 2:5b-8

... Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, existing in the form of God, did not consider equality with God as something to be used for His own advantage. ⁷ Instead He <u>emptied</u> Himself by assuming the form of a servant, taking on the likeness of men. And when He had come as a man

in His external form, ⁸ He <u>humbled</u> Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death—even to death on a cross.

We are being given a son (His name shall be called ...) and God is emptying Himself.

= letting go of the privileges of divinity AND adding humanity.

When the angels had left them and returned to heaven, the <u>shepherds</u> said to one another, "Let's go straight to <u>Bethlehem</u> and see what has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." ¹⁶ They hurried off and found both Mary and Joseph, and the baby who was lying in the <u>manger</u>.

Luke 2:17-20

After seeing them, they reported the message they were told about this child, ¹⁸ and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. ¹⁹ But Mary was treasuring up all these things in her heart and meditating on them. ²⁰ The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had seen and heard, which were just as they had been told.

What made Christmas (=promises, purposes, plans of God) possible: <u>HUMILITY</u>

{come up ONE at a time}
What will make THIS Christmas better?

→ Have I humbled myself?

{one slide}

Humility:

being freed from self-preoccupation but rather first mindful and conscious of God—in His highness AND lowliness—and then seeing ourselves in proper relation to Him.

The manger: absence of God's presence is actually the sign of it

- \rightarrow At some point in our lives, we will be involved in circumstances that seem to contradict the character, promises and purposes of God.
- 1) If it does not look like God is working ... well, He is!
- 2) Can we believe and trust that our "not perfect" is still under God's purpose?
- 3) Can we forsake **self-exaltation**?
- 4) Can we forsake **self-pity**?
- 5) Can we ... dare we ask the question ... "Have I humbled myself?"
