IN THE CAR:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

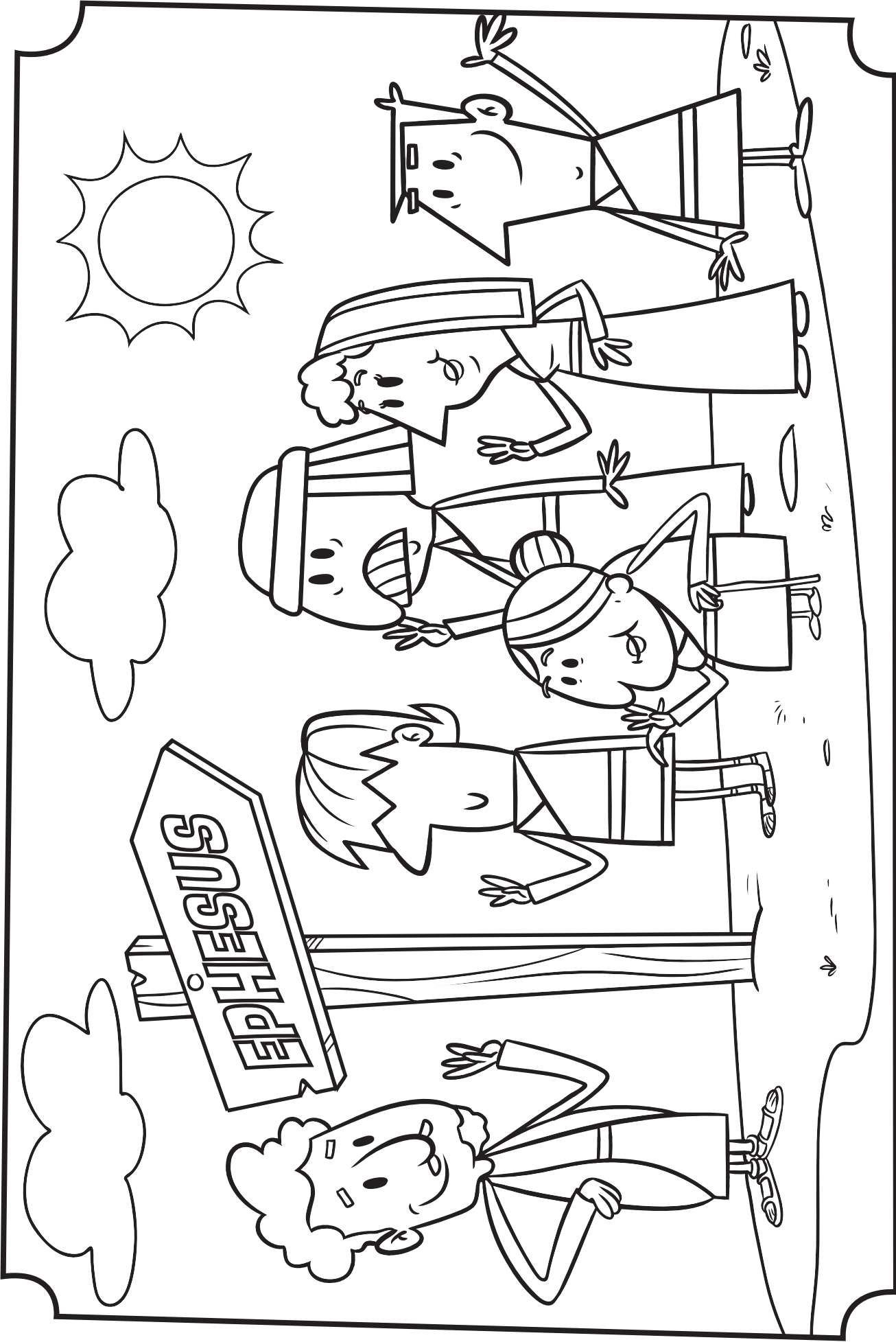
