Acts 1:6-8 (NLT)

So when the apostles were with Jesus, they kept asking him, "Lord, has the time come for you to free Israel and restore our kingdom?"

⁷ He replied, "The Father alone has the authority to set those dates and times, and they are <u>not for you to know</u>. ⁸ But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And <u>you will be</u> my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere—in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and <u>to the ends of the earth</u>."

There is information that we do not get to know, nor do we need to know.

Deuteronomy 29:29 (NLT)

The Lord our God has <u>secrets known to no one</u>. We are <u>not accountable for them</u>, but we and our children are accountable forever for all that He has <u>revealed</u> to us, so that we may obey all the terms of these instructions.

Genesis 1:26-28

Then God said, "Let Us make man in <u>Our image</u>, according to Our likeness. They will rule the fish of the sea, the birds of the sky, the livestock, the whole earth, and the creatures that crawl on the earth." ²⁷ So God created man in His own image; He created him in the image of God; He created them male and female.

²⁸ God <u>blessed</u> them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful, multiply, <u>fill the earth</u>, and subdue it. <u>Rule</u> the fish of the sea, the birds of the sky, and every creature that crawls on the earth."

God gives strategic direction more than tactical details.

Today:

- More information than ever before ... at our fingertips.
- More choices than ever before ...

"Our brains are busier than ever before ... facts, pseudo facts, jibber-jabber, and rumor ... all posing as information."

God's purpose for people in creation (Genesis) and redemption (Acts) is that we be/become a type of person:

- Capable of empowered initiative
- Dignity of <u>responsibility</u>
- With a healthy sense of accountability to God.

I Kings 3:1-3

Solomon made an alliance with Pharaoh king of Egypt by <u>marrying Pharaoh's</u> <u>daughter</u>. Solomon brought her to the city of David until he finished building his palace, the Lord's temple, and the wall surrounding Jerusalem. ² However, the people were <u>sacrificing on the high places</u>, because until that time a temple for the Lord's name had not been built. ³ Solomon <u>loved the Lord</u> by walking in the statutes of his father David, but he also sacrificed and burned incense on <u>the high places</u>.

I Kings 3:4

The king went to <u>Gibeon</u> to sacrifice there because it was the <u>most famous high place</u>. He offered a thousand burnt offerings on that altar.

I Kings 3:5

⁵ <u>At Gibeon</u> the Lord appeared to Solomon in a dream at night. God said, "<u>Ask</u>. What should I give you?"

We just need to be amazed (again and again) by God's unending grace and always "in play" grace.

Psalm 42:8

The Lord will command <u>His lovingkindness</u> in the daytime; And His song will be with me in the night, A prayer to the <u>God of my life</u>.

God remains committed to His plan for people ... and His people need His grace.

<u>I Kings 3:6</u>

And Solomon replied, "You have <u>shown great and faithful love</u> to your servant, my father David, because he walked before you in faithfulness, righteousness, and integrity. You have continued this great and faithful love for him by giving him a son to sit on his throne, as it is today.

I Kings 3:7-8

"Lord my God, you have now made your servant king in my father David's place. Yet I am just a youth with <u>no experience in leadership.</u> ⁸ Your servant is among your people you have chosen, a people <u>too many</u> to be numbered or counted.

Solomon at the crossroads with humility, a sense of his limitations, and the size of his new role.

- Will he succumb to paralyzing fear & insecurity?
- Will he shrink from initiative, responsibility & accountability?
- Will he DQ himself?
- Will he make a "comfort zone" request?

I Kings 3:9a

So give your servant a <u>receptive heart</u> to judge your people and to <u>discern</u> between good and evil. ...

{one slide; all together}

Solomon asks for a specific grace to be the type of person God created & redeems.

- Receptive, open, teachable heart
 - Discernment; wisdom

Important Observation:

• No area of life is beyond the need for God's wisdom, off-limits to God's wisdom, or unaffected by the absence of His wisdom.

Wisdom/Discernment:

capacity to see things from God's perspective and then respond according to the principles, purposes and ways of God, which He has revealed primarily through His Word.

→ Fills the gaps between the ways of life and the Word of God so that we walk as people of God.

<u>l Kings 3:9b</u>

... For who is able to judge this great people of yours?"

... only the person who prioritizes receiving the grace of personal transformation.

- vs. immediate gratification; relief; escape
- vs. being right, validated, approved of

<u>l Kings 3:10-13a</u>

Now it <u>pleased the Lord</u> that Solomon had requested this. ¹¹ So God said to him, "Because you have requested this and <u>did not ask</u> for long life or riches for yourself, or the death of your enemies, but you asked <u>discernment for yourself to administer</u> <u>justice</u>, ¹² I will therefore do what you have asked. I will give you a <u>wise and</u> <u>understanding heart</u>, so that there has never been anyone like you before and never will be again. ¹³ In addition, I will give you what you did not ask for: both riches and honor ...

God wants to put us in certain situations & positions and then empower us to reflect Him wherever we are!

Wisdom from God = grace of *discerning* how best to reflect God's goodness onto people and into situations.

 - Always for the good of others and the glory of God?

3) Am I really ready to pray ...

 \rightarrow Lord, in this what is the wise thing to do and/or the wise way to be ...?

- That aligns with Your revealed will?
- That aligns with Your purposes?
- That reflects Your goodness?

{put the bold name and the verse on same slide ... can be split screen} Wounded Ambassador <u>2 Corinthians 5:20</u> (TLB) We are <u>Christ's ambassadors</u>. God is <u>using us</u> to speak to you: we beg you, as though Christ Himself were here pleading with you, receive the love He offers you—be reconciled to God.

{put the bold name and the verse on same slide ... can be split screen} Christ: Our Wounded Healer <u>2 Corinthians 5:21</u> (TLB) For God took the <u>sinless</u> Christ and <u>poured into Him our sins.</u> Then, in exchange, He <u>poured God's goodness into us</u>!
