My Mistakes in Decision-Making:

1-[X] Big is better than small.

Zechariah 4:10a

For who despises the day of small things?

Luke 16:10 (NIV)

"Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much ...

2-[X] Spiritual life (religion) is about avoiding hell and getting help.

I Peter 3:18 (NASB)

For Christ also died for sins once for all, *the* just for *the* unjust, so that He might bring us to God ...

 \rightarrow the "with" God life

3-[X] Visible is better than invisible.

<u>I Peter 1:8</u> (NLT)

You love Him even though you have <u>never seen Him</u>. Though you do not see Him now, you trust Him; and you rejoice with a <u>glorious, inexpressible joy</u>.

2 Corinthians 5:7

For we walk by faith, <u>not</u> by sight.

4-[X] Having is better than being.

Luke 12:15 (MSG)

Speaking to the people, He went on, "Take care! Protect yourself against the least bit of greed. Life is <u>not</u> defined by what you <u>have</u>, even when you <u>have</u> a lot."

5-[X] Meditate on your mistakes & missteps.

<u>Joshua 7:6,10</u>

But as for us, brothers and sisters, after we were forced to leave you for a short time (in person, not in heart), we greatly <u>desired</u> and <u>made every effort to return</u> and see you face to face. ¹⁸ So we wanted to come to you—even I, Paul, time and again—but <u>Satan</u> hindered us.

Paul's Situation:

- A young church is facing opposition
- He wants to visit in person
 - Repeatedly blocked
 - o Satan ...??

Therefore, when we could <u>no longer stand it</u>, we <u>thought it was better</u> to be <u>left alone</u> in Athens. ²And we sent <u>Timothy</u>...

Dynamics of the Decision \rightarrow KINDGOM INITIATIVE

- Intense emotion ... pressure
- "We" is involved
- Athens is a tough place
- Send Timothy: *travel; staffing; costs; dangers*

I Thessalonians 3:1-2

Therefore, when we could no longer stand it, we thought it was better to be left alone in Athens. ² And we sent Timothy, <u>our brother</u> and <u>God's coworker</u> in the gospel of Christ ...

{one slide; come up one point at a time}

Timothy: believer, church member, partner

- He knows WHOSE He is, WHO He is, and WHY He is
- Identity and purpose are settled, not searches

1) This decision/direction is not an <u>existential</u> quest but rather an <u>expression</u> of Whose, who and why I am.

"So long as there is some thought of personal advantage, some idea of acquiring the praise and commendation of men, some aim of self-aggrandizement, it will be simply impossible to find out God's purpose concerning us." {F.B. Meyer}

I Thessalonians 3:2

And we sent Timothy, our brother and God's coworker in the gospel of Christ, to strengthen and encourage you concerning your faith ...

2) This decision/direction is aimed at <u>love</u>.

Philippians 2:3-4

Do nothing out of selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility <u>consider others</u> as more important than yourselves. ⁴ Everyone should look not to his own interests, but rather to the <u>interests of others</u>.

How do I best <u>REFLECT</u> the love that I have <u>RECEIVED</u> from Jesus?

What if Timothy ... went to Thessalonica seeking to prove himself? Gain control?

I Thessalonians 3:2-4

... we sent Timothy ... to strengthen and encourage you concerning your faith, ³ so that no one will be <u>shaken by these afflictions</u>. For you yourselves know that we are <u>appointed to this</u>. ⁴ In fact, when we were with you, we told you in advance that we were <u>going to experience affliction</u>, and as you know, it happened.

3) This decision/direction is not <u>swayed by affliction</u>; it can survive contact with the enemy.

Psalm 138:8

The Lord will <u>fulfill His purpose</u> for me. Lord, Your <u>faithful love</u> endures forever; do not abandon the work of your hands.

\rightarrow WELCOMING PRAYER

Letting go of our desire for security, control, & affirmation to embrace the moment as ordained by God.

4) This decision/direction is connected to a holy burden.
