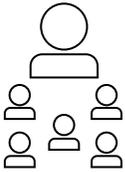
Pray for everyone who will attend Stellar.

Ask God to prepare your heart and the hearts of the kids and leaders who will be part of VBS.



Have a plan, but be flexible.

If you have only a few Crews at each rotation, you may have time for all three game options. **Delays in Large Group, or just varying personalities of kids affect how you will execute each rotation. Know your games and plan well so you can be flexible and make decisions in the moment when necessary.**




Determine the number of Crews you'll have in each rotation.

Know how your campus rotation schedule works and how many kids you will have in each rotation how many groups you will divide up in for the various games.



Arrive early and check your supplies.

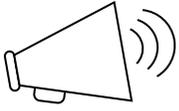
Your supplies should be ready for you each day, but a walk through before service launch will ensure your success!



Coordinate with your Co-Leaders and utilize Crew Leaders.

Team work will be invaluable to your success. Prior to each day, review the games so you **can give good directions to Crew Leaders** to help you prepare, distribute, and collect the game supplies.

DURING STELLAR



Use an attention-getting signal.

Attention-getting signals let kids know when it's time to stop what they're doing and look at you. Examples include:

Leader: "1, 2, 3... Eyes on me!" Kids: "1, 2... Eyes on you!"

Leader: "If you hear me, clap once!" (Clap once and wait.) "If you hear me, clap twice!" (Clap twice and wait.)

Leader: "Mission control to crew!"

Kids: "Ready for launch!" (Sit up straight and freeze like astronauts preparing for takeoff.)



Call on kids' to help

Every day, allow kids who are paying attention to pass out supplies, read Scripture, or be your helper.

Kids love feeling important and helpful!



Play Music from the AWVBS Playlist while kids play.

Music creates a fun atmosphere and, more important, reinforces faith!



Repeat the daily Bible Point often.

Every activity focuses on one memorable Bible truth called the Bible Point. Repeating the Bible Point helps kids remember it and apply it to their lives after VBS. Each time kids hear the day's Bible Point, they fling out their fingers and say, "Shine Jesus' light!"



Learn (and use) names.

While you won't have the opportunity to spend one-on-one time with participants, kids and adults will be wearing name badges. Try to call people by name.

TOKENS

This year, our kids will participate in a Token Challenge! To recognize and encourage meaningful participation and positive behavior, we will be rewarding kids with tokens throughout VBS!

- **Who is giving out tokens:** All of our volunteers will receive tokens to reward kids as they catch them engaging well in VBS.
- **What are we doing with the tokens:** Kids will work together to reach an Overall Token Goal and receive a celebration on the last night of VBS! Tokens are used to reward kids for remarkable expressions of love, kindness, great listening, participation, and memorizing our Main Points and Bible verse!
- **When are we passing out tokens:** Immediately! We want to help kids connect their positive attitudes, behaviors, and participation with the reward of the token, so as soon as you see a behavior to celebrate, pass out the reward!
- **Where are we getting tokens from:** We will have tokens available for all volunteers at check-in each night. As we use up our stash, there will be designated spots to go to for more throughout the night.
- **How do we distribute tokens:** Our volunteers will keep their eyes and ears tuned in to our kids so they can immediately reward them with a token to celebrate what we want repeated! They will praise the specific behavior that earned the reward when we give them their token. For example:
 - Active engagement during each rotation
 - Invite kids to “Show Me What You Know!” and let them earn a token by sharing the memory verse, finishing the lyrics to a worship song, sharing today’s “Main Point”, etc.
 - Displays of the fruit of the spirit - love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, self-control, gentleness
 - Demonstrating good manners, listening attentively, and following instructions the first time they're asked
 - Being respectful to volunteers, peers, and the VBS environment.
- **When do kids turn in their tokens:** There will be buckets available at each rotation for kids to drop their tokens in. All tokens will be brought to the closing session and combined so we can see how we're progressing towards our goal each night!
- **Remember, the goal of using tokens is to reinforce positive behaviors,** encourage active participation, and create a fun and rewarding experience for all kids attending VBS. Thank you for your commitment to making VBS a memorable and impactful event!


The Light of Jesus Changes Hearts!

Bible Story: Jesus accepts Zacchaeus. (Luke 19:1-9)

Bible Verse: “The Son of Man came to look for the lost and save them. (Luke 19:1)

Leader Insights

- Zacchaeus’ role reminded God’s people of the dark oppression they faced. Jesus—an astounding teacher and leader—provided a ray of hope!
- The Roman government employed Jews like Zacchaeus to collect its overwhelming, heavy taxes. People paid taxes on everything from land to property, as well as customs on imports and exports. That’s why many Jews viewed tax collectors as Jewish traitors who served the hated Romans.
- Tax collectors gathered a higher tax than required, pocketing the difference for themselves. Since Zacchaeus was the chief tax collector—a high position with many officials under him—he became rich from the over taxation of his people.
- Many wealthy priests called the fertile city of Jericho home. In addition, its situation on a border would yield rich customs duties for local tax collectors.
- Welcoming a popular rabbi into his home for a meal would’ve been a huge honor for Zacchaeus. However, Jesus said he needed to stay at Zacchaeus’ home! Scholars suggest that Jesus still had 17 miles on his trek to Jerusalem. He’d need an overnight stay in Jericho before departing.
- The name Zacchaeus means “pure one.” Interesting, in light of the salvation he received through Jesus
- (Luke 19:9).



Why It Matters Today

Zacchaeus was a man who made bad choices, but when he met Jesus, everything changed! Jesus didn’t ignore or reject him—He showed love and kindness, and that changed Zacchaeus’ heart. Just like Zacchaeus, we all need Jesus to help us make right choices and love others well. When we follow Jesus, His light shines in us and helps us grow to be more like Him. No matter who we are or what we’ve done, Jesus’ love can change our hearts!

Day 1 Supplies:

- **Day 1 Posters (1/station)**
- Flashlights or glow sticks (representing Jesus' light)
- Cones, pool noodles, or chairs (to create an obstacle course)
- "Space debris" items (hanging balls of foil, hanging paper plate planets, stars, etc)
- Various colored paper plates (planets)
- Permanent marker
- small bowl
- cotton swabs (1 per Crew)

Before You Blast Off

- Create an obstacle course with cones, ropes, tunnels, hula hoops, any items you have. Create 2-3 courses, depending on how many crews you will have in each rotation.
- Add "space debris" to items in your obstacle course to create the illusion of moving through space.

Welcome!

Give Crews a big welcome to Day 1 of All-Star Activities. Introduce yourself and your Co-Leader(s).

SAY This week we're not just learning about shining Jesus' light—we're learning how to shine His light too!

The Bible contains the truth about Jesus' love for everyone! That's news everyone should have. Let's play a game to remind us of our Memory Verse for this week!

Game 1: Light Speed Memory Verse Relay

SUPPLIES: Flashlights or glow sticks (representing Jesus' light), Cones, pool noodles, or chairs (to create an obstacle course), "Space debris" items (hanging balls of foil, hanging paper plate planets, stars, etc), Various colored paper plates (planets), Permanent marker

SAY Alright, space explorers! Today, we're going to play a game to help us remember our Bible verse, John 8:12b (NIRV). Jesus said, *I am the light of the world. Anyone who follows me will never walk in darkness. They will have the light of life.*

That means when we follow Jesus, His light guides us, just like a flashlight helps us see in the dark!

Now, here's how our game works. I'm going to divide you into 2 groups, and each team will get a special flashlight. This flashlight represents Jesus' light, which helps us find our way.

In front of you is an obstacle course—you'll have to run, dodge, and weave through space debris to get to the other side! Along the way, you'll find different colored paper plates, which are our planets! Grab one planet, and when you get to the end, hand the planet to me, and you will repeat the first part of the verse to a leader:

"I am the light of the world."

Play music and keep the atmosphere high energy as the relay begins. Have another leader at the end of the other course to help kids repeat the verse. Encourage Crew Leaders to cheer for kids by name and get their crews cheering for them as well.

Once everyone has gone through, have kids go through again and repeat back the next part of the verse: "anyone who follows me will never walk in darkness."

Have kids all stand together and repeat the last line: "They will have the light of life."

Practice saying the verse all together 3-4 times.

Game 2: Zacchaeus, Where Are You?

This hide-and-seek-style game mirrors Zacchaeus' desire to see Jesus and Jesus' ability to see and call Zacchaeus, even when he was hiding in a tree. Throughout the game, emphasize how Jesus seeks us out and how His light can find us and change us, no matter where we are.

SUPPLIES: Cones or chalk to define boundaries, "Tree" spots marked with hula hoops, circles, or Xs on the ground (representing trees Zacchaeus might have climbed), *Optional:* glow bracelets or stickers for kids who get "found" (to show their "changed heart")

Set Up:

- Draw 5–8 circles with sidewalk chalk (about 3–4 feet in diameter), spaced out around the play area (OR use hula hoops)
- Create a "Changed Heart Zone" Off to the side, mark a small area with cones or chalk. This is where kids go after Jesus finds them. You can hand out glow bracelets or stickers here as a fun reward and visual of their "changed heart."

How to Play:

- Choose 1 leader to be "Jesus." (This can be an adult or a teen volunteer.)
 - All other kids are "Zacchaeus." They will pretend to hide by crouching down in one of the "tree spots".
- Spread "trees" (chalk circles, hula hoops, etc.) around the play area.
- On the leader's signal, Zacchaeuses run around, finding a tree to hide in.
- Jesus slowly walks around and says: "Zacchaeus, Zacchaeus, where are you? I want to come to your house today!"
- Kids can wave or call out "Here I am!" when they're ready to be found.
- Jesus gently walks over, calls them by name (if possible), and says: "Jesus loves you!" or "Jesus sees you and wants to be your friend!"
- That child then walks with Jesus to the "Changed Heart Zone" (a designated area marked with cones or mats). Give them a sticker or glow bracelet!
- Repeat until all Zacchaeuses have been "found."
- Let each child have a turn pretending to be Jesus if time allows.

SAY

Today in our Bible story, we met a man named Zacchaeus. He was short, the crowd was huge, and he really wanted to see Jesus—so what did he do? That’s right—he climbed a tree!

But here’s the cool part: even though Zacchaeus thought he was just trying to see Jesus... Jesus already saw him. Jesus called him by name and changed his life that day!

In this game, you’ll pretend to be Zacchaeus, trying to stay out of sight and away from the crowd. But watch out—because someone playing Jesus is going to be looking for you! And when Jesus sees you and calls your name, you’ll get to join the “changed heart” team—because **The Light of Jesus Changes Hearts!**

Extra Time:

If you have extra time, consider letting each child have a turn pretending to be Jesus.
