Genesis 1:31 (AMP)

God saw everything that He had made, and behold, it was <mark>very good</mark> and He <mark>validated</mark> it completely.

<u>Genesis 3:8b-11</u>

... they <u>hid from the Lord God</u> among the trees of the garden. ⁹So the Lord God called out to the man and said to him, "Where are you?" ¹⁰And he said, "I heard you in the garden, and I was <u>afraid</u> because I was <u>naked</u>, so I hid."

¹¹Then he asked, "Who told you that you were naked? Did you eat from the tree that I commanded you not to eat from?"

Many of us walk through life amassing a sense of who we are through all the <mark>feedback</mark> pinging back at us.

<u>Galatians</u>

• Paul has to correct a church

Galatians 1:10 (NLT)

... I'm not trying to win the approval of people, but of God. If <u>pleasing people</u> were my goal, I would not be Christ's servant.

Galatians 2:3-5

But not even Titus, who was with me, was <u>compelled</u> to be circumcised, even though he was a Greek. ⁴This matter arose because some <u>false brothers</u> had infiltrated our ranks to spy on the freedom we have in Christ Jesus in order <u>to enslave us</u>. ⁵But we did not give up and <u>submit to these people</u> for even a moment, so that the <u>truth of the gospel</u> would be preserved for you.

Galatians 2:9 (NLT)

In fact, James, Peter, and John, who were known as pillars of the church, recognized the <mark>gift God had given</mark> me, and they <mark>accepted</mark> Barnabas and me as their <u>co-workers</u>. They encouraged us to keep preaching to the Gentiles, while they continued their work with the Jews.

Snapshot of Paul:

Who he is in Christ has given him settled affirmation, acceptance and approval. He is free from people-pleasing and can live authentically and courageously. Galatians 2:11

But when <mark>Cephas</mark> (*Peter*) came to Antioch, I <mark>opposed him to his face</mark> because he stood <mark>condemned</mark>.

Galatians 2:12-13

For he regularly ate with the Gentiles <u>before</u> certain men came from James (*Jerusalem church*). However, when they came, he <u>withdrew and separated himself</u>, because he <u>feared</u> those from the circumcision party. ¹³Then the rest of the Jews joined his <u>hypocrisy</u>, so that even Barnabas was led astray by their hypocrisy.

Acts 10:34

Peter began to speak: "Now I truly understand that God doesn't show favoritism ...

Acts 11:20-23 (NLT)

... some of the believers who went to Antioch from Cyprus and Cyrene began preaching to the Gentiles about the Lord Jesus. ²¹ The power of the Lord was with them, and a large number of these Gentiles believed and turned to the Lord.

²²When the <u>church at Jerusalem</u> heard what had happened, they sent Barnabas to Antioch. ²³When he arrived and saw this evidence of God's blessing, he was <mark>filled with joy</mark>, and he encouraged the believers to stay true to the Lord.

Galatians 2:14a

But when I saw that they were deviating from the truth of the gospel ...

Paul could have called out favoritism and racism ... but those are fruits. He goes to the root!

Galatians 2:14-16

But when I saw that they were deviating from the <u>truth of the gospel</u>, I told Cephas in front of <u>everyone</u>, "If you, who are a Jew, live like a Gentile and not like a Jew, how can you compel Gentiles to live like Jews?"

¹⁵We are Jews by birth and not "Gentile sinners," ¹⁶ and yet because we know that a person is not justified by the works of the law but by faith in Jesus Christ, even we ourselves have believed in Christ Jesus. This was so that we might be justified by faith in Christ and not by the works of the law, because by the works of the law no human being will be justified. "Gentiles to live like Jews"

• Gain God's approval through laws, rituals, ceremonies, etc.

"Justified ..."

- Legal term
- Opposite of condemnation
- Being righteous: rightly related to God & His rule

"truth of the gospel ... Justified ... by faith in Jesus Christ ..."

 \rightarrow What does this *really* mean?

God is going to issue judgement.

<u>Romans 2:6; 3:10</u> (NLT)

He will judge everyone according to what they have done ... as it is written: *There is no one righteous, not even one*.

God is going to issue judgement.

- According to <u>truth</u> (Romans 2:2)
- According to works (Romans 2:5-6; 3:10)
- According to <u>Christ</u> (Romans 4:25)

<u>Romans 4:25</u>

He was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification.

<u>Romans 8:1</u>

... there is now <u>no</u> condemnation for those <u>in</u> Christ Jesus ...

2 Corinthians 5:21

He made the One who did not know sin to be sin <mark>for us</mark>, so that <mark>in Him</mark> we might become the <mark>righteousness of God</mark>.

Romans 6:3-4a, 5

... are you unaware that all of us who were <u>baptized into Christ Jesus</u> were baptized <u>into</u> His death? ⁴Therefore we were buried with him by baptism <u>into</u> death ... 5 For if we have been united with Him <u>in</u> the likeness of his death, we will certainly also be <u>in</u> the likeness of his <u>resurrection</u> (see Romans 4:25)

<u>Justified</u>: freed from the fear of judgement of <mark>God in the future</mark> and of <mark>people in the</mark> <mark>present</mark>

"Justification is God's last-day verdict about us that's been brought forward for us to enjoy this present day." {Sinclair Ferguson}

Justification is not subject to <mark>degrees</mark>; it is an irrevocable <mark>declaration</mark> (verdict) of God

Peter: allowed the approval (fear of disapproval) of people to erode his grasp of the approval the gospel gives and the settled status of justification provides.
