


In God's Big Story

Families, use this to prompt conversations at the table, in the car, and anywhere else your family experiences life together.

- What's the least lovable animal you can think of? What's the most loveable animal? Why those animals?
- Would you rather others tell you they love you or show you? Why?
- What are three ways God has shown His love to our family?





For this game, you'll blindfold (shutting one's eyes works too) a family member and then spin that person several times while holding her shoulders. Other family members will scatter around the room while saying, "I love you" as the blindfolded person attempts to tag them. Watch that your blindfolded family member doesn't lose balance or crash into a wall! Play several rounds, changing who's blindfolded in each round. When everyone has had a turn, point out that we're all drawn to love, and there's no better place to look for love than to God!





For Me?

It's field trip time! As a family, go to a general merchandise store. Before going explain: Each family member has \$500 in imaginary money to "buy" gifts that reflect their love for other family members. (Consider bringing board-game paper money!) The gifts can be anything, but the total can't exceed \$500. Shop together or split into teams, with an adult on each team. Keep a running list of gifts and costs or snap pictures of each gift chosen. After your shopping time is up, take turns telling each other what gifts they didn't get with money that doesn't exist. It's the thought that counts!

Children should stay with an adult for safety and possibly some help with math.

After your imaginary gift exchange, take turns encouraging each family member with the gift of loving words and sincere compliments. God shows us He's loving by giving us the gift of salvation through Jesus. We can share gifts with people we love too!
