Will I be a Christian by 10:00 am? Friday night? At work?

- Compartmentalize
- Acting vs. Reacting
- Circumstances
- Revert back to old patterns ('ruts')

Goal (Need a LIFE TOOL!) \rightarrow consistency ... (perhaps) integrity

<u>Acts 20:17</u>

Now from Miletus, he sent to Ephesus and summoned the elders of the church.

Acts 20:18

When they came to him, he said to them, "You know, from the first day I set foot in Asia, <u>how</u> I was with you <u>the whole time</u> ...

Acts 20:18-21

When they came to him, he said to them, "You know, from the first day I set foot in Asia, how I was with you the whole time, ¹⁹ serving the Lord with all humility, with tears, and during the trials that came to me through the plots of the Jews. ²⁰ You know that I did not hesitate to proclaim anything to you that was profitable and to teach you publicly and from house to house. ²¹ I testified to both Jews and Greeks about repentance toward God and faith in our Lord Jesus.

- Paul was consistently Christian ...
 - Even when afraid (courageous)
 - Even when plotted against
 - Even when tempted to "look out for #1"
- Paul was a Christian to the MAX ...
 - $\circ~$ Not just an ethical, ritual, and/or traditional Christian

Paul ("serving the Lord with <u>all</u> humility ...")

• Understanding of himself in relation to the Lord

Paul had integrated into his life the beauty and power of the <mark>self-image</mark> given to him by God in the Gospel.

• Self-Image: how we think about ourselves

Commercials:

- Car: think of yourself in relation to what you have
- Beer: think of yourself in relation to the "good life"

- Life insurance: think of yourself in relation to your family
- Clothing: think of yourself in relation to your body
- Athletic gear: think of yourself in relation to how you perform

At 10:00 am? On Friday Night? At Work?

- Think of yourself in relation to what you could gain or lose
- Think of yourself in relation to what others think of you
- Think of yourself in relation to what is happening to you

The Christian's Self-Image:

- God-given
- Gospel-bought
- Kingdom-driven

Colossians 3:10-11

... have put on the <mark>new self</mark>. You are being renewed in knowledge according to the <mark>image of</mark> <mark>your Creator</mark>. ¹¹ In Christ there is <mark>not</mark> Greek and Jew, circumcision and uncircumcision, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but <u>Christ is all and in all</u>.

- We "lose" the self-image of a Christ-follower
- Instead ...
 - We have to earn, control, defend ... (= unloving)
 - Adversity is an existential threat (= fearful; anxious)
 - Life is to be controlled OR complained about (= w/o peace)

Acts 20:22-24

"And now I am on my way to Jerusalem, <u>compelled</u> by the Spirit, <u>not knowing</u> what I will encounter there, ²³ except that in every town the Holy Spirit <u>warns</u> me that chains and <u>afflictions are waiting</u> for me. ²⁴ But I <u>consider</u> my life of <u>no value to myself</u>; my purpose is to finish <u>my course</u> and the ministry I <u>received</u> from the Lord Jesus, to testify to the gospel of God's grace.

Living with a Christian Self-Image:

- Clarity about who and do
- The will of God and providences of God are not threats
- Difference between loss and waste of life
- Vigilance & Stability = perseverance
