Immediate availability of God's Kingdom

- Call
- Cost
- Commitment

Everyone wants to be happy.

What is God's role in our happiness?

- He helps us get it & keep it (or He's supposed to).
- His authority & competence are limited to certain areas.
- He wants us to be happy so just follow your heart.
- He's the cosmic killjoy.
- It's just all up to us.

Here is life inside the immediately available Kingdom of Heaven ...

Matthew 5:1-3a

When He saw the crowds, He went up on the mountain, and after He sat down, His disciples came to Him. ²Then He began to teach them, saying: ³"Blessed are the ..."

1) Not only does God (~King Jesus) want us to be happy, He has the <u>authority and the</u> <u>ability</u> to make it a reality.

This happiness is unlike the kind of happiness the world offers, and we often seek.

Matthew 5:3

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for the kingdom of heaven is theirs.

2) God Himself is infinitely and eternally happy.

Exodus 3:13-14 (CSB)

Then Moses asked God, "If I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your ancestors has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is His name?' what should I tell them?"

¹⁴ God replied to Moses, "IAM WHO I AM. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: IAM has sent me to you."

God: self-sustaining, self-sufficient Being = "My Being sustains My being"

John 5:26 (ESV)

For as the Father has life in Himself, so He has granted the Son also to have life in Himself.

God = completely perfect, infinitely happy, & overflowing goodness

→ Plenitude of God ...

Happiness flowing from the immediately available Kingdom of Heaven here now in the presence of Jesus (physically in Matthew's Gospel but today by the Holy Spirit) and our commitment to learn (disciples) to fully live there.

Psalm 16:11

You reveal the path of life to me; in Your presence is abundant joy; at Your right hand are eternal pleasures.

Psalm 23:1

The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want.

The Lord is my shepherd; I have all that I need.

The Lord is my shepherd; my life is without lack.

Contact and connection with the King/Kingdom always starts in the mind.

Colossians 3:1-2

So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ² Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things.

Four Problematic Settings of the Mind:

- a) Faulty images of God.
- b) The visible & material (vs. the spiritual, the unseen)

<u>John 4:24</u> (ESV)

God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth.

2 Corinthians 4:18 (CSB)

... we do not <u>focus</u> on what is seen, but on what is <u>unseen</u>. For what is seen is temporary, but what is <u>unseen is eternal</u>.

c) The <u>self-life</u> (self-admiration, self-confidence, self-posturing, self-focus, self-pity, etc.).

Matthew 5:5,10-12

Blessed are the <u>humble</u> (*meek*) for they will inherit the earth ... 10 Blessed are those who are <u>persecuted</u> because of righteousness, for the kingdom of heaven is theirs.

¹¹ "You are blessed when they <u>insult you and persecute you and falsely say</u> every kind of evil against you because of Me. ¹² Be glad and rejoice, because your reward is great in heaven.

Kingdom living comes at the expense of the ego.

d) Worldly Pragmatism: will it work in the world → What does it mean to follow Jesus the King??

Matthew 5:3-12

- "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for the kingdom of heaven is theirs.
- ⁴Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.
- ⁵Blessed are the humble, for they will inherit the earth.
- ⁶ Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.
- ⁷Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.
- ⁸ Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.
- ⁹ Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called sons of God.
- ¹⁰ Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for the kingdom of heaven is theirs.

I do not have what "it" takes ... (poor in spirit)

I have holy discontentment and/or godly sorrow ... (mourn)

I am increasingly less self-reliant, more self-forgetful and God-conscious ... (meek)

I long for the fullness found only in God ... (hunger & thirst)

I do not deserve what I have received; therefore, I treat others the way God has treated me

I am growing in single-mindedness—I just want God and His Kingdom ... (pure in heart) I pursue peace with others because God made peace with me (peacemakers) I more and more live righteously regardless of the cost ... In Jesus' Kingdom, I have all I need.

- 1) Consider the **audience** of the Sermon:

 - b) ALERT us ... drawing near or drifting away
