You want me to do what?!?!
How can you expect me to do that?

x6 Contrasts (Sermon on the Mount):

- Murder/Anger
- Adultery/Lust
- Divorce
- Oaths

Final 2 Contrasts:

- Eye for an eye/Turn the other cheek
- Love ... your enemy
- → The "Driver" or "Source" of Behavior:
 - Anger
 - Unmet expectations (marriage)
 - Fantasized desire (i.e. lust)
 - My rights; what I am 'owed'
 - Duty; what's required/expected

Matthew 5:46-47

For if you love those who love you, what reward will you have? Don't even the tax collectors do the same? ⁴⁷ And if you greet only your brothers and sisters, what are you doing out of the ordinary? Don't even the Gentiles do the same?

I Corinthians 3:4 (NLT)

When one of you says, "I am a follower of Paul," and another says, "I follow Apollos," aren't you acting just like people of the world?

Kingdom people have a different driver (source) that produces Kingdom behavior.

Matthew 5:43-45a

"You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor' and 'hate your enemy.' ⁴⁴ But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, ⁴⁵ so that you may be children of your Father in heaven ...

Matthew 5:48

Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect.

God's children//Kingdom people love like the Father loves.

In a sense, we are ALL loving people (tax collectors, Gentiles, etc.).

• The way the world loves VS the love of the Father

The World's Love (or ordinary people):

- Loves until ... let down, betrayed, forsaken, disappointed, etc.
- Love for ... a return, a reciprocal response, etc.

The Love of God:

- Has no limit or boundary; endless
- Is not determined by "love-ability"
- Is not calculating and cautious (like ours).
 - Free & unrestrained

God's love is uncaused and undeserved.

Romans 5:8 (NLT)

But God showed His great love for us by sending Christ to die for us while we were still sinners.

Awareness of our lack of "love-ability" (unloveliness) is what helps us know and experience the endless love of God.

If we believe we are "love-able" to a degree, we could feel loved to a degree but we've never be astonished nor transformed by how loved we are.

Ephesians 3:17-19 (CSB)

... I pray that you, being rooted and firmly established in love, ¹⁸ may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the length and width, height and depth of God's love, ¹⁹ and to know Christ's love that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

Acknowledging our sinfulness & messiness actually awakens us to be transformed and satisfied by God's love ...

 \rightarrow ... and then to offer that love to others.

Matthew 5:45b

... For He causes His sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous.

What makes us not ordinary (= *Kingdom people*) is that the love we love with is NOT controlled by the object, expectation or response.

The love we love with is controlled by our will/heart, which has joyfully surrendered to the full reality of God and His Kingdom.

Matthew 5:38-42

"You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.' ³⁹ But I tell you, don't resist an evildoer. On the contrary, if anyone slaps you on your right cheek, turn the other to him also. ⁴⁰ As for the one who wants to sue you and take away your shirt, let him have your coat as well. ⁴¹ And if anyone forces you to go one mile, go with him two. ⁴² Give to the one who asks you, and don't turn away from the one who wants to borrow from you.

Our world is NO longer defined or controlled by our rights, reputation, trauma/pain, or enemies.

We automatically act and re-act out of the soil in which we are rooted.

Matthew 5:43-45a

"You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor' and 'hate your enemy.' ⁴⁴ But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, ⁴⁵ so that you may be children of your Father in heaven ...

Identify **blockages** to God's love ...

- 1) Look at the **evidence** of our lives:
 - a) Suffering
 - b) Sin & folly

My life does not disprove God's love; the life of Jesus proves it!

Identify **blockages** to God's love ...

- 2) From whom are you withholding God's love:
 - a. Yourself?
 - b. Your enemy? The one miler?
