We all want to WIN.

Genesis 1 (repeated)

And God saw that it was good.

Genesis 1:27-28a (NLT)

So God created human beings in <u>His own image</u>. In the image of <u>God</u> He created them; male and female He created them. ²⁸ Then God <u>blessed</u> them and said, "<u>Be</u> fruitful and multiply. <u>Fill</u> the earth and <u>govern</u> it. <u>Reign</u> over ... {*fish*, *birds*, *every living thing*}.

If I follow God, will I still win?
Will God do what I want?
Will God come through for me?
God loves but is He competent?

Matthew 6:1

"Be careful not to practice your righteousness in front of others to be seen by them. Otherwise, you have <u>no reward</u> with your <u>Father</u> in heaven.

Father (x10)

The direct availability of God to nurture, provide, sustain ...

Rewards (x9)

The desire of God to bless and reward.

Jesus is presenting God as the decisive and dominant presence in our lives.

Life in the Kingdom does NOT change the fact that our hearts have desires and are wired for rewards.

→ But it does change where the heart looks!

FATHER ... Man upstairs? REWARDER ... Withholder?

Jesus' bold implication: The **Superiority of God** (as Father; Reward).

Matthew 6:2-4

So whenever you give to the poor, don't sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and on the streets, to be applauded by people. Truly I tell you, they have their reward. ³ But when you give to the poor, don't let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, ⁴ so that your giving may be in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

PATTERN (of the 3 illustrations):

- Human ACTION with INTENTION (the why: reason, motive, desire)
- SHIFT: looking to God as Father and Rewarder
- 1) We are not settling for less but rather trusting God our Father for the best.

Matthew 6:5-6

"Whenever you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites, because they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by people. Truly I tell you, they have their reward. ⁶ But when you pray, go into your private room, shut your door, and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

2) We must resist the temptation to pursue <u>immediate and right now</u> rewards rather than trust God our Father for <u>eternal and better</u> rewards.

Matthew 6:19-20

"Don't store up for yourselves <u>treasures on earth</u>, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal. ²⁰ But store up for yourselves <u>treasures in heaven</u>, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves don't break in and steal.

When do we want to win?

Earth can be really convincing can't it?

Matthew 6:7-8

When you pray, don't babble like the Gentiles, since they imagine they'll be heard for their many words. ⁸ Don't be like them, because your Father knows the things you need before you ask Him.

Matthew 6:16-18

"Whenever you fast, don't be gloomy like the hypocrites. For they disfigure their faces so that their fasting is obvious to people. Truly I tell you, they have their reward. ¹⁷ But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, ¹⁸ so that your fasting isn't obvious to

others but to your <u>Father</u> who is in secret. And your <u>Father</u> who sees in secret will <u>reward</u> you.

3) We must understand that we are not rewarded for our performance but our dependence (~where we set our hearts to look).

Our dependence showcases His sufficiency.

Our satisfaction showcases His superiority.

Matthew 6:9 (ESV)

Pray then like this: "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name."

Revelation 21:3-7

Then I heard a loud voice from the throne: Look, God's dwelling is with humanity, and He will live with them. They will be His peoples, and God Himself will be with them and will be their God. ⁴ He will wipe away every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; grief, crying, and pain will be no more, because the previous things have passed away. ⁵ Then the One seated on the throne said, "Look, I am making everything new." He also said, "Write, because these words are faithful and true." ⁶ Then He said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. I will freely give to the thirsty from the spring of the water of life. ⁷ The one who conquers will inherit these things, and I will be His God, and He will be my son.
