Something is going on ... something's happening ...

- Pastoral conversations & interactions
- Bible sales are UP
- Gen Z (1997-2012) ... college campuses

There are **counterfeits**.

2 Corinthians 11:13-14 (JB Ph)

They are counterfeits of the real thing ... Nor do their tactics surprise me when I consider how Satan himself masquerades as an angel of light.

God works through **His Word** and His Word does the work!

• Created, rules, redeems, & relates, & revives through His word!

<u>Isaiah 55:11</u> (NIV)

... My word that goes out from My mouth: It will not return to Me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it.

Ecclesiastes 8:4 (ESV)

For the word of the king is supreme ...

Psalm 85:6-8 (NLT)

Won't you revive us again, so your people can rejoice in you? ⁷ Show us your unfailing love, O Lord, and grant us your salvation. ⁸ I listen carefully to what God the Lord is saying, for Hespeaks peace to His faithful people. But let them not return to their foolish ways.

There are deceptions.

Ephesians 5:6 (ESV)

Let no one deceive you with empty words ...

2 Timothy 4:3-5 (JB Ph)

For the time is coming when men will <u>not</u> tolerate wholesome teaching. They will want something to tickle their own fancies, and they will collect teachers who will <u>pander to their own desires</u>. They will no longer listen to <u>the truth</u>, but will wander off after <u>man-made</u> <u>fictions</u>.

What happens when the word of God works \rightarrow When God works ...? Matthew 7:28-29

When Jesus had finished saying these things, the crowds were astonished/amazed at His teaching, ²⁹ because He was teaching them like one who had authority, and not like their scribes.

1) A sense of the quality of His word: the weight of authority.

"... like one who had authority"

Abraham Kuyper:

"The veil is gradually pushed aside. The eye turns toward the Divine Light that radiates from Scripture, and now our inner ego sees the imposing superiority ..."

His word or Mine?

- Calm & gentle
- Invites faith: trust & confidence
- Not argumentative

Greatest Threat: self-confidence

Isaiah 66:2 (ESV)

All these things my hand has made, and so all these things came to be, declares the Lord. But this is the one to whom I will look: he who is humble and contrite in spirit and trembles at My word.

2) A recognition of inner tension

Teaching of Jesus vs. scribes

We all learned to live from someone (or something) else.

Who has taught me? Whose disciple am I?

Tension → **Resistance**

By nature, we resist deep, inward change.

- Threatening & Unfamiliar
- Power of pattern/habit
- Unbelief

Obedience threatens abundance (LIE)

Kingdom <u>obedience</u> is Kingdom <u>abundance</u> (TRUTH)

3) A growing clarity around identity

"He was teaching them ..."

Disciple (student; apprentice) of Jesus:

 \rightarrow I am learning from Jesus to <u>live my life</u> as <u>He would live</u> it

Identify Restrictions:

- a) Make the final cut when you die Christianity
- b) Religious times & services
- c) Lack of confidence in Jesus ... at work, in relationships, \$\$, etc
- d) No vision of the "with-God" life \rightarrow Coram Deo

Coram Deo:

- Find fullness in the fullness of God
- Forge fellowship in the family of God
- Follow Jesus in ministry & mission

There is no problem that discipleship to Jesus will not solve!

There is no greater privilege than life in and with Christ!
