In God's Big Story

Isaiah shares the promise that Jesus will come as a light to God's people, and this promise is fulfilled 700 years later when Jesus—the Prince of Peace—is born.

Wonder Truth: Jesus Is Our Peace
Scripture: Isaiah 9; John 14

WORD OF WONDER Motions

Learn these motions together and practice every day before a mealtime:

FAITH—Make prayer hands.
IS BEING SURE—Make a fist with one hand and put it down on your other hand (open palm).
OF WHAT WE HOPE FOR—Put your fist down onto your open palm once for each word (what, hope).
AND SURE—Hands on your hips.
OF WHAT WE DO NOT—Hold one finger up and shake it back and forth ("No, No").
SEE—Put your hands by your eyes like binoculars.
FROM HEBREWS 11:1—Hands open like a book.

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The series Word of Wonder reminds us that the hope we have in Jesus—the Prince of Peace—is certain! Read Hebrews 11:1 as a family and incorporate your favorite words from it into an original breath prayer. (A breath prayer is a word or phrase to repeat in a single breath with one part on the inhale and the other part on the exhale.) For example, you might pray like this:

Inhale: *Jesus...*

Exhale: *You are my sure hope.*

Next go as a family to a place that feels peaceful to you in your city, neighborhood, or home. While in your peaceful place, close your eyes, breathe deeply, and practice this new breath prayer together. Encourage your family to pray this prayer anytime they feel anxious.

WORSHIP RESPONSE Prince of Peace

The prophet Isaiah tells us that the Savior will be called the "Prince Who Brings Peace" and that "the peace he brings will never end" (Isaiah 9:6–7). Many years later, Jesus, the Savior, came to earth and told His followers that the peace He gives isn't like the world's peace (John 14:27). What does it mean to you that Jesus is the Prince of Peace? How is the peace Jesus gives different from the peace the world gives?

Spend some time worshipping the Prince of Peace together! Begin by drawing the shape of a crown on paper. Write "Prince Who Brings Peace" on the crown. Decorate the crown by writing words of praise to Jesus for who He is. (Younger kids can draw pictures!) Use words from Isaiah 9 and others that come to mind. When finished, place the crown in the middle of where your family is gathered and sing along to one or two favorite Christmas worship songs.

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
