Theme

Preparing for the Day

Set up the room:

- Set up the balloon rocket string across the room, with balloons, tape, and straws ready.
- Prepare lantern craft station with pre-cut templates, coloring supplies, stickers, LED lights, string, and tape/glue.

Tips for leaders:

- Reinforce the Bottom Line: **The Holy Spirit helps us share about Jesus**. Use the phrase often.
- Keep it active and visual. Use gameboard or quest language and actions when possible. Get creative!
- Use a simple position cue when you need quiet: Quest position, eyes here (kids get still and look).
- Praise bravery and positive behavior: I like the way you stayed still while waiting.
- Give short, specific choices: Do you want a red or blue crayon?
- Use movement: Stand for answers, repeat key words, and do hand motions.
- Give clear instructions to Crew Leaders and Assistant Leaders.



What You Need

- Themed stickers/tattoos to give kids who brought back their KQ Log
- A small remote control car or battery powered toy that moves
- Batteries

Welcome (1-2 minutes)

Welcome, friends! I'm [name], your Crew Guide for the week.

This week we are on Kingdom Quest to discover God's Kingdom. Let's review what we've learned so far. Say these with me:

Day 1: **Jesus invites us to follow Him.** Point to Day 1 Bottom Line Poster.

Day 2: **Jesus helps us trust Him!** Point to Day 2 Bottom Line Poster.

Day 3: **Because of Jesus, I am saved!** Point to Day 3 Bottom Line Poster.

Today, we are learning **The Holy Spirit helps us share about Jesus.**

Opening Activity (1-3 minutes)

Power to Go

How You Prepare

- Remove batteries from the toy ahead of time and keep them handy.
- Test toy ahead of time so it will work smoothly when batteries are inserted.

What You Do

Hold the toy up and act excited. Try to make the toy move without batteries, look confused, then prompt kids to help. Put batteries in quickly and make the toy go so kids see the change. Tie this visual to the idea that the disciples had a mission but needed power.

What You Say

Friends, I brought an awesome toy today! Watch this.

Press the button. (pause; look confused)

Hmm. It did not move.

Why not? (pause for short responses)

Let's give it power. (insert batteries quickly and place toy down)

Watch now. (make toy move)

The car always had wheels, but it needed power from the batteries to go.

The disciples had a message and a mission, but they needed power too. Today we will hear about the power Jesus promised — the Holy Spirit — that helps us go and tell others about Jesus!

Bible Story Review (3–5 minutes)

What You Need

- Balloons
- String
- Tape
- Drinking straws
- One long piece of string stretched tightly across the room
- Optional second balloon for demo



Balloon Rocket Demo

How You Prepare

- Stretch a long piece of string across the room and secure it tightly. Thread a drinking straw on the string. Tape one inflated and untied balloon to the straw (do not tie balloon). Keep inflation low until demonstration time.
- Have assistant nearby to help with inflation and safe handling of balloons.
- Remind leaders: balloons are not for mouths; supervise closely.

What You Do

- Gather kids seated facing the rocket string. Use the balloon to show invisible power (air) making the balloon move.
- Link to the Holy Spirit — unseen but powerful.
- Use very short interactive prompts: pointing near/far to show mission scope and a short “freeze/wait” moment to show waiting for the Spirit.
- End with loud “power” cheer and Bottom Line repeat.

What You Say

I’m sad today is our last day, but we have something really cool to help us learn about the Holy Spirit’s power!

Before we start, let’s do our Kingdom Quest Chant together. Repeat after me and add your motions:

Jesus invites us to follow Him—I follow His light! (Kids repeat)

Called on a quest to do what’s right! (Kids repeat)

Step by step, I trust and obey! (Kids repeat)

His Kingdom grows in me each day! (Kids repeat)

Jesus came back to His friends after He rose. He told them they had a big job — to tell everyone about Him.

But first, Jesus told them to wait for something very important. He said they would get power from the Holy Spirit.

(Hold up a balloon, not yet inflated.)

This balloon is like the disciples before the Holy Spirit. It is there, but it is not going anywhere yet.

(Blow up balloon a little and keep it closed at the opening.)

When I let it go, watch what the air does.

(Release balloon along the straw so it zooms.)



Leader Tips:

- Keep balloon pieces and broken balloons away from kids immediately; have a trash bag ready.
- Never let kids hold inflated balloons near their mouths; leaders handle inflation and release.
- Use short sentences and keep the demo lively but controlled.
- Use crew leaders to help kids point near/far and to manage attention.

What made it move? (brief pause)

That's right, air! We could not see the air, but we could see what it did. The Holy Spirit is like that — we do not see Him, but we see how He helps.

Jesus told them they would be His witnesses near and far.

Point close to you — that is near. Point a little farther — that is your neighborhood. Point all the way across the room — that is far.

Stretch your arms wide — that is everywhere!

But first, they had to wait. Freeze like you are waiting.
(pause 3 seconds)

Unfreeze!
(Inflate second balloon a little, hold.)

When the Holy Spirit came, the disciples had power to share about Jesus. On three—shout the word power. One, two, three—POWER!
(release balloon)

Let's say our Bottom Line together: The Holy Spirit helps us share about Jesus. (kids repeat once)

Prayer & Reflection (2-3 minutes)

What You Say

Friends, let's get our bodies ready to talk to God.

Sit still like a little lamp shining bright. Hands in your lap, eyes looking up here.

Let's make our bodies still and our voices quiet.

Put your hands on your shoulders. Lift them up to the sky — now bring them down slowly. Let's do that one more time.

Now, put your hands over your heart and close your eyes. Repeat after me:

God fills me with His power. (Kids repeat)

The Holy Spirit helps me share about Jesus. (Kids repeat)

I can tell others about Jesus every day. (Kids repeat)

Clasp your hands together and close your eyes one more time as I pray for you now.

Jesus, thank You for sending the Holy Spirit to give us power. Thank You for loving us and helping us share about You. Help these kids be brave, shine their light, and tell others about Your love. Amen.

What You Need

- lantern templates 1/kid pre-cut
- Scissors 1/older kid/rotation
- Crayons, markers, or colored pencils
- Star stickers
- Metallic stickers
- Tape or glue sticks
- Mini LED balloon lights or small battery LED lights **with the loop** 1/kid
- String pieces (4-5 inches each) 1/kid
- Extra tape for securing lights
- Kingdom Quest Take Home Sheet (1/kid)

Craft

(7-10 minutes)

SENT Lantern

How You Prepare

- Cut out all lantern templates ahead of time.
- Pre-cut the vertical strips in the center section.
- Pre-cut string pieces for lights.
- Test all LED lights to ensure they work.
- Prepare supplies divided by crews ahead of time.

What You Do

- Give each child a template, coloring supplies, and stickers. Encourage them to decorate their lantern however they like.
- Gently roll the lantern into a cylinder shape and tape or glue the short ends together.
- Attach the paper handle to the top.
- Thread a string through the mini LED light and tape or secure the ends to the inside top edges of the lantern so the light hangs in the middle.

What You Say

Today you are creating a lantern to remind you of something very important.

In our Bible story, Jesus promised the Holy Spirit would come and give His followers power.

They were sent to share about Jesus, but they were not sent alone. The Holy Spirit is like this light. Hold up the light.

You cannot see air, but you see what it does. In the same way, we cannot see the Holy Spirit with our eyes, but we see how He gives courage, boldness, and power.

As you decorate, think about where God might be sending you — your home, school, or team.

Leader Tip:

Keep instructions one step at a time. Focus language on simple truths: *God helps me. The Holy Spirit gives me power.*

Add stars to remind you that God's power shines bright. Use metallic stickers to show that His Kingdom is greater than anything in this world.

When we add the light, watch what happens.

Turn on one lantern as a demo.

The lantern does not shine by itself. It shines because of what is inside it.

We do not share about Jesus because we are brave on our own. The Holy Spirit gives us the power.

When you see this lantern glow, remember that you are sent, and you are not alone.

Everyone hold up your lantern with me while we say our Bottom Line.
The Holy Spirit helps us share about Jesus.

Kingdom Quest Take Home Sheet

Give each child a Kingdom Quest Take Home Sheet and encourage them to show their parents and bring back the bottom part for a sticker tomorrow!
