## FAMILY CONVERSATIONS

Families, use this to prompt conversations at the table, in the car, and anywhere else your family experiences life together.

- What did Cain do that was wrong?
- What does it mean that God redeems us? (*When God redeems something, He takes what is broken or ruined and turns it into something beautiful.*)
- How did God redeem and take care of Cain after he sinned? (*God protected Cain's life.*)
- How does it feel to know God can make good things out of bad situations?
- What can you do the next time you make a bad choice and sin?



## CREATE IT!

### Old Crayon Craft

For this craft, you'll need to gather bits of old, broken crayons. You'll also need a canvas or thick paper, glue, and a blow dryer.

**Did you know we can use old and broken crayons to create something beautiful? Let's try it today.**

Take paper wrappers off crayons and glue the pieces to the top of a canvas. Run a blow dryer on the highest heat setting over the crayons so that they melt and the wax runs down the canvas. (For safety, only adults should hold the blow dryer.) Once the colors melt, hold the blow dryer at different angles so that the colors run and swirl together. This will help create a unique piece of art using the wax. Allow the wax to cool.

**What do you think about our new piece of art?** Invite everyone in the family to share. **We redeemed our crayons. When something is redeemed, it's given a new life and a new purpose. God redeems us. No matter how many times we do or say the wrong thing, God is always there for us and ready to forgive. He has a plan and a purpose for our lives.**
