WALK IT ACT IT MOVE IT

Tumbling Walls

Great
for
Younger Kids!

For this activity, you'll need an open space, a Bible, toys or boxes for stacking (such as interlocking bricks, food storage containers, or cardboard boxes), and sheets of paper. To help kids remember the events of Joshua 6, act out the story together.

First, build a tall, strong wall. Then pretend to be the Israelites gathered outside the city of Jericho. Choose one person to be Joshua and huddle up a few feet from the wall. Invite Joshua to repeat these words: **The only thing between us and the land God promised is the city of Jericho, but the walls are too high and thick to conquer! Thankfully, God gave us directions, so we know what to do.**

Next read Joshua 6:1–5 and pretend you're Israelites walking around the wall. Use rolled up paper as trumpets and shout out on the "seventh day" as you circle the city seven times. After that, the wall may need a little help falling down! The Israelites conquered Jericho because God told them what to do, and God leads us too!



INTERACTIVE PRAYER

Bricks of Prayer

Older Kids!

As a family, build a wall together using boxes. Each time you add a box (or "brick"), list something challenging in life—things that at times can feel like walls (e.g., friendship challenges, hard assignments in school, financial challenges, being sick, etc.).

Say aloud the words in bold: **It seemed an impossible task for the Israelites to defeat the great city of Jericho. But God knew exactly how to lead them! God leads us too. Let's pray together and ask God to lead us and help us with all of the things our "bricks" represent.**

At the end, disassemble the wall, tossing each box to the ground and declaring: God will lead us in our _____ (insert the corresponding challenge from your list).

PARENT TIP: If your family has older and younger kids, combine these two activities. You can build the wall, sharing challenges. Then you can review the story then march around the wall as you reenact Joshua 6. Finally, you can knock it down, declaring that God will lead you!
